Grade aluminium and steel has affected the progress of rural electrification. Measures have been taken to meet the requirements by allocating priority quotas from indigenous production and by arranging for imports, wherever necessary. To meet the shortfall in the indigenous supply of mild steel rounds required for rural electrification schemes, the Government of Tamil-Nadu had requested for release of foreign exchange for the import of 10,000 tonnes. Foreign exchange as

requested by the Government of Tamil Nadu has been released by the Government of India. In addition, 2800 M. Tons of Boiler Quality Plates and 400 Metric Tons of mild steel are under import for Tamil Nadu State Electricity Board. Further imports during 1971-72 for this Board are being processed.
