PANT): (a) and (b) The legislative proposals to give effect to the recommendations of the Committee on Defections were discussed by the Prime Minister with the leaders of all political parties on December, 10, 1970. As the discussions in the meeting were inconclusive, the Prime Minister also wrote to the leaders of all political parties inviting their specific reaction to the proposed legislation. Replies from some leaders are still awaited.
