

**CONTRACT FOR SUPPLY in BULK-  
CARRIERS OF 15,001 D.W.T.**

313. SHRI B. C. PATANAYAK: Will the Minister of PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS AND SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT (SHRI RAJ BAHADUR): (a) The contracts were not concluded recently but in 1969, The Indian shipowners who have contracted to purchase the ships are:—

(a) the terms of the contracts recently entered into with the Rumanian Shipyards for the supply of 15,000 D.W.T. each;

(b) the reasons for which the contracts have been entered into with the Rumanian Shipyards; and

(c) the time by when the delivery of the bulk-carriers is expected?

THE MINISTER OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS AND SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT (SHRI RAJ BAHADUR): (a) The contracts were not concluded recently but in 1969, The Indian shipowners who have contracted to purchase the ships are:—

Each ship costs Rs. 15.75 crore. 15 per cent of the price is payable upto delivery and the remaining 85 per cent together with interest at 2.5 per cent per annum is payable in ten annual instalments commencing one year after delivery of each ship.

(h) It is not as if offers were available from several foreign shipyards and preference was given to the Rumanian shipyard. Ships of this size and type were required to meet the country's requirements and since Rumania offered these ships on a rupee payment basis without involving an foreign exchange outgo, the proposal was approved by Government.

(e) The schedule of delivery of the 10 bulk-carriers is as shown below:—

**PUBLICATION OF DISTRICT GAZETTEERS**

314. SHRI JAGDISH PRASAD MAHANT: Will the Minister of EDUCATION AND SOCIAL WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) what is the progress achieved so far in regard to the publication of district gazetteers; how many of them have been published so far, how many are awaiting publication and how many still remain to be prepared; and

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION AND SOCIAL WELFARE (SHRI SIDDHARTH SHANKAR RAY): (a) Gazetteers of 171 Districts have been completed, of which 61 have been published and 110 are awaiting publication. Gazetteers of 163 Districts are yet to be completed.

(b) No Sir. The question will be taken up after the scheme is completed in all the States.

**INDIAN PUBLISHERS' VISIT TO AFRICAN COUNTRIES**

815. SHRI K. L. N. PRASAD: Will the Minister of EDUCATION AND SOCIAL WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that a seven member team of Indian publishers visited Africa; in countries to familiarise itself with the conditions of education and book trade there;

(b) if so, how many countries they have visited; and

(c) whether they have submitted any report to Government in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION AND SOCIAL WELFARE (SHRI SIDDHARTH SHANKAR RAY): (a) A six member team went, for at the last minute one of the members was unable to go.

(b) Four, namely, Mauritius, Zambia, Tanzania and Kenya.

(c) The Delegation has just returned to India and a report from them is awaited.

**H. V. R. JENGAR'S STATEMENT ON INFLATIONARY TREND**

(b) if so, what is the reaction of the Government of India in this regard?
