CONTRACT FOR SUPPLY OF BULK-CARRIERS OF 15,000 D.W.T.

- 313. SHRI B. C. PATTANAYAK: Will the Minister of PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS AND SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT be pleased to state:
- (a) the terms of the contracts recently entered into with the Rumanian Shipyards for the supply of ter bulk carriers of 15,000 D.W.T. each;
- (b) the reasons for which the contracts have been entered it to with the Rumanian Shipvards; and
- (c) the time by when the delivery of the bulk-carriers is expected?

THE MINISTER OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS AND SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT (SHRI RAJ BAHADUR): (a) The contracts were not oncluded recently but in 1969. The Indian shipowners who have contracted to punchase the ships are:--

Mogal Line . . . 5 ships Shipping Corpor tion . 4 ships Chowgule Steam hips . 1 ship

Each ship costs Rs. 1.37 crores. 15 per cent of the price is pay; ble upto delivery and the remaining 85 p r cent together with interest at 2.5 per c nt per annum is payable in ten annual instalments commencing one year after delivery of each ship.

- (b) It is not as if offers were available from several foreign shippy rds and preference was given to the Rumanian shippard. Ships of this size and type we're required to meet the country's requirements and since Rumania offered these ships on rupee payment basis without involving an foreign exchange outgo, the proposal was approved by Government.

- THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION AND SOCIAL WELFARE (SHRI SIDDHARTHA SHANKAR RAY): (a) Gazetteers of 174 Districts have been completed, of which 91 have been published and 83 are awaiting publication. Gazetteers of 163 Districts are yet to be completed.
- (b) No Sir. The question will be taken up after the scheme is completed in all the States.

## H V. R. IINGAR'S STATEMENT ON INFIA-TIONARY TREND

316. SHRI LOKANATH MISRA: Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the attention of Government has been drawn to a statement by the former Governor of the Reserve Bank of India, Shri H. V. R. Iengar made in Bombav on the 11th February 1971, and published in the Times of India on February 12, 1971 to the effect that India would have to face the unpleasant prospect of further devaluation of the rupee if the present inflationary situation continued; and
- (b) if so, what is the reaction of the Government of India in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF FINANCE (SHRIY. B. CHAVAN): (a) Yes, Sir.
