#### SHORTFALL IN COAL PRODUCTION

Will the Minister of PETROLEUM AND CHEMICALS AND MINES AND METALS be pleased to state :

(a) whether it is a fact that the total production of coal by the National Coal Development Corporation in the first six months of the current year was more than million tonnes less than the target fixed ;

(b) if so, the reasons for the shortfall in production ; and

(c) what steps have been taken by the Corporation to step up coal production ?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PETROLEUM AND CHEMICALS AND NON-FERROUS METALS (SHRI NITIRAJ SINGH CHAUDHARY) : (a) Yes, Sir. The actual production of coal during the first six months of the current year was 6.64 million tonnes as against a target of 15.37 million tonnes fixed by the Corporation for the full year.

(b) The production was restricted so as to match with demand, which was low due to :

- (1) continued low off-take of washed coal by the steel plants ;
- (2) lack of sufficient orders for Gr. I slick coal particularly in Karan-pura area ;
- (3) the complete stoppage of movement on the South Eastern Railways for some days in June and July and later on the Eastern Railways in September besides partial dislocation of rail transport over long period during July to September due to strikes and labour troubles on the Railways ; and
- (4) heavy rains during August and September, affecting production in a number of mines.

(c) Production will be stepped up when overall coal demand particularly coking coal picks up. The transport problems are discussed then and there with the concerned Railway Authorities who have been requested to take measures to improve the wagon supplies, N.C.D.C. has programmed for a production of about 16 million tonnes in 1971-72 as against the actuals of about 14 million tonnes in the current year.
