I'lial aspect has also to be taken into tons deration.

Now, Sir, rlii- problem has many aspects and other spea ters who spoke before mi have dealt with this problem from various angles. \i for nyself, 1 do not want to look at it on a short-term basis. 1 am not trying to look at it from the point of view of what ran be done immediately or next year or in the coming five years. Looking at the growth >f the problem since independence, I a n convinced that it is high time thai we I iked at the problem from the long-term \ ewpoint. We should find some solution i i a long-term basis. When I say thai out I lans were not based on correct methods, winciples and strategy, T mean thai our planning' did not lay em-phasis, in the beginning, on the most important and I. sii indusry of this country, i.e., agrirultu. I lie Second Five Year Plan complete^ neglected agriculture. The Thiol Five Yeai Plan tried to belynoh with the idea of doi! I lomething to hobnob with the idea of doil; lomething to agriculture. Only in the Fc ith Five Year Plan I find that an atteni I has been made. The neglect of agrict 'lure, which employs about SO per cent of our population, is one of the basii cause for not having developed our economy on correct lines. If the economy is not dev loped on correct lines. naiiu.ilK it cannot provide employment which is very tecessary and which is a pan of it. Seroii llv. this is a basic question ih, ii I want to place before the House. We talk of ind tstiial revolution. We talk of developing i ur economy through industrialisation.

It is quite o rrect. We must try to develop industr tllv and try to catch up with other ind strially developed countries: try to be nodern, try to be a big nation. But thr question that was posed before this conn ty after independence was: What should be the strategy and basis of our industrial information. strategy and basis of our industrial irogrammes? Unfortunately we tried to unit lie and copy.
