**THE MINISTER OF REVENUE AND

SHUKLA):** (a) and (b) Improving the performance of Public Enterprises is a continuous process. The decisions already taken by Government on the recommendations of the Administrative Reforms Commission in their Report on Public Sector Undertakings are being implemented. Mainly, the measures already initiated are directed to effect improvement in the working of the Public Enterprises by (a) improvements in managerial and operational efficiencies (b) diversification of production lines and (c) promotion of exports. Specific measures taken in these directions are improved investment appraisal ; introduction of performance budgeting, internal audit and cost accounting systems ; reduction of inventories ; introduction of modern materials management techniques ; economising of working capital requirements, etc. The situation is kept under constant review and remedial measures taken where necessary.
