With a view to ensuring transparency and efficacy in the implementation of Rural Development Programme, including SGRY, the Ministry has prepared a panel of National Level Monitors involving Senior Level Ex-Servicemen and Retired Civil Servants to monitor the policy and implementation environments of the programmes at the grass root level. National Level Monitors shall also be required to look into various specific complaints regarding implementation of programmes, as and when required by this Ministry.

Pending projects under Total Sanitation Programmes

- 671. SHRI M.A.M. RAMASWAMY: Will the Minister of RURAL DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:
- (a) whether a number of project proposals regarding implementation of Total Sanitation Programme of various States are pending with the Central Government, for the last three years;
 - (b) if so, the details thereof, State-wise, year-wise;
- (c) the total allocation sought for by the State Governments for each project;
 - (d) the reasons for keeping the proposals pending; and
- (e) the steps taken by the Central Government to clear these important projects?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT (SHRI A. NARENDRA): (a) to (e) State Governments have sent proposals for sanction of TSC projects in 465 districts of the country in last three years and till date. Out of these, TSC projects have been sanctioned for 341 districts so far. In remaining 124 districts, fund @ Rs. 10.00 lakhs, each have been sanctioned for conducting Base Line Survey and preparing detailed project report. Out of these, project reports in respect of 16 districts of Jharkhand State and one of Gujarat State have been received recently which are under process for sanction. The projectwise allocation sought by State Govt. for these projects is given in the Statement.
