(b) Government have not felt it necessary to conside, at present, the question of nations lisation of tea trade. Proposals to set up public sector corporations fc r trading in raw jute and marketing tea are, however, under consideration.

POLICE OUTPOSTS IN RANIGANJ COAL BELT

- (a) whether Government propose to open 11 police outposts in Raniganj coal belt as reported in the Statesman on the 5th October, 1970.
