NATIONALISATION OF TOBACCO, TEA AND JUTE RADE

1381. SHRI R. P. KHAITAN: Will the Minister of FOI EIGN TRADE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government have received any representations recently for the nationalisation of tobacco, tea and jute trade; and
- (b) if so, the reaction of Government in the matter?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF FOREIGN TRADE (CHOWDHARY RAM SEWAK): (a) Representations hav been received only for nationalising tea industry and taking over the entile trade in jute.

(b) Government have not felt it necessary to conside, at present, the question of nationalisation of tea trade. Proposals to set up public sector corporations for trading in raw jute and marketing tea are, however, under consideration.

POLICE OUTPOSTS IN RANIGANJ COAL BELT

1382. SHRI KALYAN ROY: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government propose to open 11 police outposts in Raniganj coal belt as reported in the Statesman on the 5th October. 1970.
- (b) what are the reasons for opening these police outposts;
- (c) whether they will be located in colliery quarters in the area; if so, where; and
- (d) whether Government propose to examine the role of the police in the Raniganj coal belt in view of serious criticism about its role in curbing trade union movements at the instigation of colliery owners?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI K. C. PANT): (a) to (d) According to the information furnished by the Government of West Bengal, 11 police camps have been set up temporarily in the coal belt area under Asansol Sub-division for law and order duties following several incidents of violence in that area in the recent past.

(2) Some of the camps have been housed for the time being in the premises belonging to the colliery
