†[SCHEME FOR RE-OPENING THE SUEZ CANAL

132. SHRI SURAJ PRASAD: Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the U.A.R. Government have sent a scheme regarding the reopening of the Suez Canal to the U.S. Government; and

(b) if so, what is the reaction of the Government of India with regard to that scheme?]

EXPENDITURE ON FAMILY PLANNING

133. SHRI J. S. TILAK: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY PLANNING AND WORKS, HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) what is the amount spent by Government for the family planning programme during the financial year 1969-70;

(b) how much of this amount has been received from foreign countries as gift, loan etc.; and

(c) when Government expect to achieve the accepted standard of birth rate per thousand of population?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY PLANNING AND WORKS, HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT (SHRI B. S. MURTHY): (a) Rs. 4,153.13 lakhs (estimated).

(b) The foreign aid received for the family planning programme has been in the nature of commodities, consultancy services and fellowships which are not reflected in the amount given in reply to part (a) above. The total amount of foreign assistance which has been received or agreed to for the programme is given in the statement attached.

(c) All efforts are being made and it is expected that the birth rate will be reduced from 39 per thousand population in 1968 to 25 by 1980.
