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बाद अब यु०एन० का मेम्बर बनने के लिए उसने एप्लीकेशनदीहै। तोक्या मतलब यह समझा जाय कि वह असंतुष्ट है ? एक वात । दूसरी बात यह कि अगर उसका मतलब यह समझा जाय, तो अब यु० एन० का मेम्बर हो जाने के बाद उसके और आपके रिलेशन्स जैसे भृतकाल में पर-राष्ट्र नीति के बारे में थे जब उस प्रकार के परराष्ट्र नीति के बारेमें रहेंगे या नहीं या वह स्वयं अभी अलग परराष्ट्र नीति का संचालन करेगा और आपके साथ में केवल मित्रता ही रहेगी ?

श्री सुरेन्द्र पाल सिंह : सभापति महोदय, मैं पहले भी कह चुका हं कि हमारे सम्बन्ध भुटान के साथ बड़े घनिष्ट और बड़े अच्छ छे हैं और इस लिये उनके डिस्सेटिस्फेक्शन का सवाल ही नहीं अब रहा सवाल उनकी इस उठता है। **ख्व**ाहिण काकिव युएनको जोइन करना चाहते है। सदस्यों को मालुम है कि किंगने 1966 में यह प्रश्न उठाया था । फिर मौके पर हमने कहा कि प्रिंसिपल में हम एग्री करते हैं, जब वे मैम्बरशिप चाहेंगे हम स्पोंसर करेंगे। इसमें किसी किस्म की देरी या रुकावट हमारी तरफ से नहीं आई, देरी सिर्फ भुटान की तरफ सेथी क्योंकि वे इसके लिए तैयार नहींथे। मेम्बर्शाप के माने मेम्बर हो जाना ही नहीं है, उनके पास ट्रेन्ड परसोनेल होने चाहिए वहां भेजने के लिए। वहां के जो फंड्स हैं उनमें रुपया देने के लिए फंड्स भी होने चाहिए। बहुत सी बातें थीं जो भटान गवर्न-मेंटको सोचनी थीं। अब जब उन्होंनेयु एन की मेम्बरशिप सीक करनी चाही, तो हमसे कहा, हमने कहा कि बडी खुणी से आईए 1971 में हम उनकी मेम्बर्शाप स्वीसर करेंगे ।

श्री निरंजन वर्माः श्रीमन, यह वड़ा महत्व-पूर्ण प्रक्त है। अगर आप लोकहित में इसका उत्तर देना उचित समझें, तो बता दीजिए कि परराष्ट्र नीति के वारे में अलगे हमारे सम्बन्ध कैसे रहेंगे।

श्री सभापति : इस सवाल का जवाब दे दीजिए ।

श्री सुरेन्द्र पाल सिंह : अध्यक्ष महोदय, मै कह चुका हं कि हमारे रिलेशन्स, हमारे सम्बन्ध ए से हैं कि कोई इस किस्म का खतरा नहीं है। हमारे सम्बन्ध पहले की ट्रीटियों के मुता-बिक चलते रहेंगे।

श्री निरंजन वर्मा: परराष्ट्र नीति के बारे में बताइए।

श्री सुरेन्द्र पाल सिंह : 1940 की ट्रीटी फारेन एफेयर्स को भी गवर्न करती है।

SHRI ARJUN ARORA: t DR. SALIG RAM: SHRI KRISHAN KANT:

Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY PLANNING AND WORKS, HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) what are the year-wise targets of Family Planning to be achieved in the Fourth Five Year Plan period;
- (b) what have been the year-wise achievements; and
- (c) what are the reasons for the shortfall?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY PLANNING AND WORKS, HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT (SHRI B. S. MURTHY): (a) to (c) A statement is laid on the Table of the Sabha.

SHRI ARJUN ARORA: Sir, this statement points out certain shortfalls in the achievement of family planning targets. For the year 1969-70, for example, the target was 5.3 millions, whereas the achievement was a little more than 50 per cent or 3.4 millions. May I know what were the reasons for this shortfall, because the reasons given in the statement are not at all convincing? The reasons given are disturbed conditions in some parts of the country and natural calamities like floods and drought. I don't understand what these conditions have to do with this programme. If some of the loops were washed away in floods. . . (Interruptions)

SHRI B. S. MURTHY I would re-quest the hon. Member to see page 2 of the statement laid on the Table of the House. The achievement for the year 1969-70 is 3.4 millions, and here it is stated that it is provisional. We have yet to get figures. All the States have not yet furnished these figures.

SHRI ARJUN ARORA: He has not replied to my question. The Ministers cannot say whatever they like and get away with it. The figures of targets and achievements are the figures given by me from pages 1 and 2 of the statement. And yet he drew my attention to the same. Why doesn't he state the reasons for the shortfalls?

MR. CHAIRMAN : Your second question?

SHRI ARJUN ARORA: My second question will come after he has answered my first question.

SHRI B. S. MURTHY: Theie is no attempt to hide anything from the hon Members. We have already stated the figures for 1969-70 provisional, as we have yet to get some more figures from the States.

SHRI K. K. SHAH: My hon, friend has only read the second part. In the first part we have admitted that there was inadequacy of infra-structure— whatever machinery we wanted to set up we could not set up—then, inadequacy of trained staff, etc.

SHRI ARJUN ARORA: My second question: How and why were such high targets fixed when, according to the Minister, there was neither the infrastructure nor the trained staff?

SHRI K. K. SHAH: This is a very debatable question. We have ourselves been debating—whether to fix high targets is desirable or not. Sometimes fixation of high targets also helps. But now we have decided that we will not set up high targets... (Interruptions).

SHRI CHITTA BASU : Is it applicable to all the targets?

SHRI KRISHAN KANT: Is it not a fact that the *per capita* income has increased up to 3 per cent and the population has increased up to 5 per cent? It means the population has completely overtaken the national income. May I know what the Governnaent is doing in this direction? Secondly, how far foreign collaboration has helped in the sense that it came at the right time? Thirdly, what ICUD research was done in the country and what achievements have been made in this respect?

SHRI K. K. SHAH: So far as his last question is concerned, research is going on, and you must have read already in the Papers that Dr. Shiralkar has invented a new method.

Regarding the rise in the population, 1 have given the target that by the end of the Fifth Plan we want to reach 2.5 which means 25 per thousand. Then it will be possible with the death rate at 12 or 13 and the total rise will be 12 per thousand. So far as collaboration is concerned, we have been receiving assistance and even this time we have received assistance and that has been useful.

श्री मान सिंह वर्मा: क्या माननीय मंत्री जी का ध्यान एक ओर नये नारे की ओर गया है जो परिवार नियोजन के खिलाफ लगाया जा रहा है और वह नारा यह है कि : अगला बच्चा अभी अभी, आट के बाद कभी कभी। तो क्या आप का ध्यान इधर गया है? यदि आप की जानकारी में ऐसा नारा लगाया जा रहा है, तो यह नारा कहां में गुरू हुआ है?

श्री के० के० शाह: हिन्दुस्तान में तरह तरह के, किस्म किस्म के आदमी हैं, तो उन किस्म किस्म के आदमियों के जो प्रचार होते हैं उन के खिलाफ हमें लड़ना पड़ना है। अच्छा हुआ जो आपने इस नारे की बात हमें वतायी। यह भी एक कारण है कि हम जितना टागेंट चाहते थे वह पूरा नहीं हुआ। लेकिन हम बहुत कुछ कर पाये हैं और उस से ही आप को पता होगा कि हमारी जो कोशिश है वह कामयाय होती जा रही है।

SHRI M. M. DHARIA: There is a feeling that the Government has not seriously taken up this challenge. If it is said that we should not have targets, I feel that in this counry more attention shall have to be paid to this very explosive situation and more funds shall have to be made available. It is not a party issue, it is a social issue. It is because of the light treatment that 1 have pass these remarks. Will the Minister assure the House that the Government will not treat this in a light vein and it shall take it as a challenge and try to tackle this on a war footing; otherwise, no plan in this country can ameliorate the grievances *in* this country?

SHRI K. K. SHAH: I am extremely sorry if my friend has looked upon my remarks as lighthearted. We give the utmost importance. I am glad that my friend has also said that enough funds should be provided. I did not want to say so. The cost per eligible couple is Rs. 135 and there are 19 million eligible couples. I have been given Rs. 315 crores during the Fourth Plan. The total cost will be Rs. 1350 crores. It depends upon the resources available. Therefore *I* said I will not have targets for which I will not be able to set up the infra-structure expected.

SHRI THILLAI VILLALAN: My supplementary is regarding the cases in which already the target is reached over and above; because of the successful implementation of family planning, there is a considerable fall in the population from 1951 to 1961 and also from 1961 to 1970 in Tamilnadu. We got 41 Members of Parliament in 1957 and 1962. Now in 1967 two Members have been reduced. We got only 39. I would like to know whether this Government is giving award or punishment for the failthful and successful implementation of family planning. Further, I would like to know whether this Government is going to have it based on population in 1971 for the purpose of delimiting the constituencies and fixing up constituencies for the elections.

SHRI K. K. .SHAH: This is a very mportant question. My hon. friend is quite correct. Our attention has been drawn by many Governments which have achieved near-targets. And this question is being consider d very seriously as to what should be jone, whether some incentive should ie given or some year should be fixed a: the year of production for Plan allocation.

SHRI K. CHANDRASEKHARAN:

Is the hon. Mini ter aware that certain political parties ir this country are complaining against the Family Planning Programme on tie ground that members of the Hindi community are being subjected more ti the Family Planning Programme and hat members of non-Hindu communit '.s are not being so subjected? May know, Sir, from the hon. Minister wr at steps are being taken at the polit cal level and the public level to count ract any such propaganda? What st< ps are further being taken to sec that all sections of the community are b ing subjected to the Family Planning Programme? May I also know from tie hon. Minister whether he is aware of the fact that there have been Press n ports that large quantities of 'Nirodh', manufactured at Tri-vandrum, are being converted into and used as balloons it the factories in Bangalore and th t all these have contributed to the sh irtfall in the achieve-Tnents of the Fa aily Planning Programme during re ;;ent years?

SHRI K. K. SHAH: I won't say 'any political part}', but there are bigots all over, in all communities, who have been carrying on uch a campaign, but I am very glad to ,ay that we have been able successfully t > meet the campaign. Even though, I think, it may be dangerous to pass on rhis information, now we have examined even community-wise, Teligion-wise, and am very glad to say that except lor a nargin of 0.1% they are all running parallel. Therefore, it has been accepted by all communities in spite of the p opaganda carried on by a number of b gots in all communities. So far as the condoms are concerned, it is true ihat in the beginning we had the comprint that some of the Nirodhs' were us d by the children as balloons. We have now tightened up the control and of lat .:, during the last six months, there has been no complaint.

SHRI S. S. MARISWAMY:

Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state :

- (a) whether it is a fact that Indian tourists are being accused by the Russian authorities for being responsible for the current outbreak of cholera in the Soviet Union;
- (b) whether the attention of the Government of India has recently been invited in this regard by several Members of Parliament; and
- (c) if so, the reaction of the Government of India in this regard?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI SURENDRA PAL SINGH): (a) No, Sir.

- (b) Yes, Sir.
- (c) Does not arise.

SHRI M. K. MOHTA: Sir, the hon. Minister has answered to part (a) of my question as "No, Sir." May I ask the hon. Minister what kind of enquiries has the Government made in this regard, because the group of M.Ps., who wrote to the hon. Minister in this regard, had definite information that Indian tourists were being accused by the Soviet authorities, and whether the Government had made any communication to the Soviet authorities and, if so, what kind of reply has the Government received for this?

SHRI SURENDRA PAL SINGH: Sir, as soon as this matter came to our notice, we asked our Embassy in Moscow to find out if there was any complaint or any allegation of this nature, and the report received from there was that no instance had come to their notice of any Indian visitor being accused by the Soviet officials of bringing cholera into the Soviet Union, nor have any complaints come to us of Indian visitors being accused of this, nor has it come to our notice that any-
