*730. SHRI I. L. N. PRASAD: Will the Ministe of DEFENCE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the normal procedure for any country planning to test fire a rocket o missile into the high seas is to give idequate warning to international shipping to steer clear of the area;
- (b) if so, wheth r China has issued any such warning regarding the possibility of its testing an IRBM in the Bay of Bengal; and
- (c) whether the indian defence experts have also ascertai ed this fact, and if so, the reaction o the Government of India in the matte?

THE MINISTIR OF DEFENCE (SHRI JAGJIVAN RAM): (a) Yes, Sir

- (c) While Government have seen Press reports regarding the possibility of China testing an IRBM in the Bay of Bengal, there is no authen ic information about this

SURVEY OF MINERALS WITH FOREIGN COLLABORATION BY GEOLOGICAL SURVEY OF INDIA

Will the Minister of PETROLUEM AND CHEMICALS AND MINES AND METALS be pleased to state

- (a) whether Go ernment's attention has been drawn to he serious critism in the press regarding the reported decision of the Geological Survey of India to conduct prospecting for mineral with foreign collaboration and foreign technicians; and
- (b) whether the Government propose to take immediate steps to utilise the services of a large number of ploved Indian technicians who are looking for jobs in the GSI for survey work; if not, the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PETROI FUM AND CHEMICAI S AND MINES AND **METALS** (SHRI **NITIRAJ** SINGH CHOUDHARY): (a) Foreign collaboration for mineral prospecting has been secured with regard to Airborne Mineral Surveys and for development of rock phospate resources in Mussorrie area. There has been some criticism in the Press in regard to the usefulness of the airborne surveys with foreign collaboration.

(b) The Geological Survey of India propose to fill 1,105 gazetted and 6,135 non-gazetted posts of scientists, engineers and technicians during the Fourth Plan period.

- (a) The total expenditure incurred against the Naval Estimates during 1967-68, 1968-69 and 1969-70 was Rs 181.46 crores It is not feasible to determine the actual expenditure which had been incurred specifically on Naval Ships
- (b) It will not be in the public interest to disclose the information.
- (c) INS VIKRANT carries fighter bomber aircraft and some helicopters. The former have a strike role latter are primarily intended for reconnaissance action against submarines and for sea air rescue. The helicopters are all modern The fighter bomber aircraft are still effective despite their age. None of them is obsolete. The Aircraft Carrier, is therefore, capable of use in an emergency in the future.
