then naturally the necessary adjustments will be made. The aim at the end of this ten-year period is to see that there is one single rate all over the country, and that one single rate will apply to Mysore also. The tsame category of load in this country mus have the same rate. I expect that it will not be so soon today, but it will be the case after ten or fifteen years.
