#### QUARTERS FOR CIVIL AVIATION STAFF

\*36g. SHRI M. V. BHADRAM : Will the Minister of TOURISM AND CIVIL AVIATION be pleased to state :

(a) whether it is a fact that more than 400 persons were transferred to Palam airport from all over India when it was taken over by the Civil Aviation Department from the Indian Air Force and that they still remain without any residential accommodation and other basic amenities for the staff;

(b) whether the accommodation still occupied by the Air Force is proposed to be taken over for providing quarters for the Civil Aviation staff;

(c) whether Government propose to construct the quarters at Safdarjung or Palam airport; and

(d) if so, the details thereof ?

THE MINISTER OF TOURISM AND CIVIL AVIATION (DR. KARAN SINGH) : (a) Out of 601 persons transferred to Palam 24 and 76 have been provided residential accommodation at Palam and Safdarjung respectively.

(b) The Air Force have already transferred one block from Palam to the Civil Aviation Department. Efforts are being made to get more accommodation.

(c) and (d) Provision for the construction of a residential colony has been made in the master plan for the development of Delhi (Palam) report.

Plans are also under examination to construct residential quarters at Safdarjung aerodrome.
