THE VICE-CHAIRMAN (SHRI AKBAR ALI KHAN): I also hope that all concerned will take a note of it.

SHRI S. D. MISRA (Uttar Pradesh): The Leader of the Opposition has just raised the point about the press and the national dailies. I have instances where the All India Radio does not give adequate publicity. . . .

THE VICE-CHAIRMAN (SHRI AKBAR ALI KHAN): The House stands adjourned till 2-30 P. M.

The House then adjourned at eighteen minutes past one of the clock.
