(b) As mentioned under (a) the multiple cropping technique is being developed under the various coordinated programmes and is being tested under the National Demonstration Scheme in all the States including Tamil Nadu and Pondicherry. In Tamil Nadu during 1968-69, sixty five multiple crop demonstrations were conducted. In 75% of the demonstration, yields exceeded the targetted yield of 9 and 11 tonnes per hectare.

In Pondicherry, 4 multiple crop trials were conducted during 1968-69 and in 50% cases the yields exceeded the targetted vields.

IRRIGATION POTENTIAL OF VIDARBHA. REGION

There are other areas in the country particularly in Western Rajasthan and in Madhya Pradesh where the percentage of gross area irrigated to gross area sown is less than 0.9 (or even nil in some case).

(b) According to the procedure in vogue, Central assistance to States is given in the form of block loan and grant of the annual plan as a whole and is not related to any specific programme or schemes. The discretion for scheme-wise or regionwise allocation of funds rests with the State Governments.

The Draft Fourth Plan provides an outlay of Rs. 65.00 crores for Minor Irrigation Programme in Maharashtra. In addition, an Institutional investment of about Rs. 100 crores is expected for private minor irrigation like wells repairs to wells, pumpacts etc., during the 4th Plan period. The State Government has been advised to raise the provision for minor irrigation in the Fourth Plan now being finalised particularly for surface water storage/ diversion projects which are essential for developing irrigation in the rainfed culti-The State has also been vation reas. advised to complete groundwater investigations in such areas on priority basis.

PRODUCTION OF OIL SEEDS IN VIDARBHA 1146. SHRI T. G. DESHMUKH: SHRI N. P. CHAUDHARI:

Will the Minister of FOOD AND AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government are aware that the production of oil-seeds particularly of groundnut in the region of Vidarbha, has been on the wane in the last decade;
- (b) if so, what are the reasons for this fall in production and how Government intents to arrest it?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FOOD, AGRI-CULTURE, COMMUNITY DEVELOP-MENT & COOPERATION (SHRI ANNASAHEB SHINDE) : (a) No, Sir. There have, however, been year to year fluctuations in the production of groundnut and other oilseeds due to variations in seasonal conditions.

- (b) For increasing the production of oilseeds, particularly groundnut, the following specific steps have been taken:
 - 1. Adoption of intensive cultivation measures on the lines of the package programme for raising the production of groundnut in Akola district over an area of 40,000 hectares, during 1969-70.
 - 2. Stabilisation of groundnut yield in scarce-rainfall areas.
 - 3. Distribution of improved seeds of linseed over an area of 10,000 hectares during 1969-70.

In addition, a scheme for intensive cultivation of linseed is proposed to be implemented over an area of 10,000 hectares in Phandara district from next

Break-Through in RESEARCH WORK REGARDING PULSES

1147. SHRI T. G. DESHMUKH: Will the Minister of FOOD AND AGRI-CULTURE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that there has not been any break-through in the research work regarding pulses, particularly 'Tur';
- (b) whether it is also a fact that the cultivation of 'Tur' is becoming unprofitable in view of long maturing period and low yields; and
- (c) whether any special reasearch is being conducted to find out new stains of early maturity and better yields; and if so, the details thereof and progress made so far in this regard?

MINISTER \mathbf{OF} STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FOOD, AGRI-CULTURE, COMMUNITY DEVELOP-MENT & COOPERATION (SHRI ANNASAHEB SHINDE) : (a) Yes. Intensive, coordinated research in pulses has been taken up only recently is still in its early stages. However, highly significant results have already been obtained in 'Tur' as well as in other pulses.
