**RECENT EDITION OF THE GREAT SOVIET ENCYCLOPAEDIA CONTAINING A MAP OF ASIA SHOWING INDIAN TERRITORY AS CHINESE**

SHRI M. K. MOHTA (J.Rajasthan): I call the attention of the Minister of External Affairs to the recent edition of the Great Soviet Encyclopaedia containing a political map of Asia showing large chunks of Indian territory as Chinese.

THE MINISTER OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SARDAR SWARAN SINGH): Sir it is unfortunate that the Soviet publications have been publishing maps containing wrong delineation of India's northern boundaries in spite of the fact that we have been continuously taking up this matter with the Soviet authorities through diplomatic channels and at higher levels.

The political map of Asia in the latest edition of the first volume of the "Great Soviet Encyclopaedia" was brought to our attention by our Embassy in Moscow in June, 1970, and
