

of view with the intention of ensuring that the objectives laid down in the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948 are realised through the Boards ;

(b) whether it is a fact that under the act of 1948, qualifications for 3 members of the Board have been laid down and if so, whether the Central Government have checked up whether the same have been adhered to by the State Governments at the time to the constitution of the Boards ; and

(c) whether the Secretaries of different Departments of the State Government are usually made part time members of the Board and if so, the reasons there for ?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF IRRIGATION AND POWER (PROF. SIDDHESH-WAR PRASAD) : (a) Last comprehensive review made by the Central Government in the Ministry of Irrigation & Power was in 1964 by a Committee appointed by the Government. This review was made with a view to improving the financial working of the State Electricity Boards. The important recommendations of this Committee, particularly those relating to achievement of financial returns, have been accepted by the Central Government and their implementation has been followed up with the State Electricity Boards from time to time.

(b) The qualifications of 3 Members of the State Electricity Board have been laid down in section 5 of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948. The Members of the Board are appointed by the State Government. No occasion has arisen for the Central Government to check whether the State Governments have been appointing the Members of the Board in accordance with the provisions of the Act.

(c) Secretaries of different Departments of the State Government may be appointed as part-time Members of the State Electricity Boards. They are usually appointed as part-time Members of the Board by the State Governments to provide for co-ordination of various activities concerning the development and utilisation of power in the State.
