BEATING OF A PRESS PHOTOGRAPHER BY R. S. S. WORKERS

## 103. DR. Z. A. AHMAD: SHRI BHOLA PRASAD:

Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the Chief Photographer of National Herald who tried to take photographs of the recently held R.S.S. training Camp in the Delhi was dragged into the camp and beaten up by the R.S.S. workers; and
- (b) if so, what action Government have taken against persons responsible for this incident?

THE MINISTER OF STATE MINISTRY OF IN THE HOME **AFFAIRS** (SHEJ K. C. PANT): (a) and (b) According to information received from the Delhi Administra-tion, on 28th May, 1970 Shri Kishore Chand, Chief Photographer of the National Herald lodged a report with the police that he had been beaten up by some R.S.S. v orkers, when he was taking photographs of their training camp in a school in Shakti Nagar. He further alleged that his camera been snatched away. He was rescued by the Superinter dent of Police and the Sub-Divisional Magistrate, who happened to arrive there. A case under sections 395/342 325 of the Indian Penal Code was registered by the Police. Two accused persons surrendered in the court on 10th June. Investigation of the case is in progress.

Another report was lodged with the Police by a person who stated that he was the guard in charge of the training camp. He illeged that Shri Kishore Chand had entered the school compound by sciling over the boundary wall. On being checked Shri Kishore Chand allegedly slapped him and snatched his wrist watch. He tried to run away, but was over-nowered. On this eport also the police registered a case, which is being investigated according to law.

## INCREASE IN FREIGHT RATES

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PARLIA-MENTARY AFFAIRS AND IN THE MINISTRY OF SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT (SARDAR IQBAL SINGH): (a) The Conference have taken a decision to effect a general increase of 12.5% in freight rates from India to U.K./Continent with special treatment to certain sensitive commodities.

## FAMILY PENSION FOR DECEASED MPS

- 105. SHRI S. A. KHAJA MOHI-DEEN: Will the Minister of PARLIA-MENTARY AFFAIRS, SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that the Government of Tamil Nadu have decided to grant pension to the families of those Members of the State Legislature who die in harness, till the expiry of their term of office:
- (b) whether the Union Government is also considering any similar proposal to grant pension to the families of the Members of Parliament; and
  - (c) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF PARLIA-MENTARY AFFAIRS AND SHIP-PING AND TRANSPORT (SHRI K. RAGHURAMAIAH): (a) It is learnt that the State Government of Tamil Nadu are considering a proposal for grant of pension to the indigent wives and minor children of the deceased Legislators for the unexpired portion of their term of office.

(b) and (c) No such proposal is at resent under consideration of the Central Government.
