- (c) The instructions issued by the Ministry of Hone Affairs from time to time emphasising the use of Hindi in Government w< rk are brought to the notice of all co leerned including senior officers. To facilitate use of Hindi by various officers >f this Department, consolidated glossary of administrative terms, dictiona ies received from the Central Hindi Directorate and all the help-literature i jceived from the Ken-driya Sachivala 'a Hindi Parishad have been distribut. d. Under the Official Languages Am> ndment Act, 1967, Official Languages Implementation Committee has ben constituted under the Chairmanship i f Additional/Joint Secretaries in eac:i Department under this Ministry. The < Yimmittee at its meetings held from time to time reviews the progress of implementation and lays continuing stress oi the need to use Hindi lor official pu poses.

THE MIN STER OF LABOUR AND REHABILITATION (SHRI D. SAN-JIVAYYA) (a) The number of Officers of tlie rank of Under Secretary and above who have been doing some

of their work in Hindi was 4, 5 and 13 at the end of 1967, 1968 and 1969 respectively.

(b) Instruction have been issued from time to time stressing the need for progressive use of Hindi in Office work. Help Literature has been provided. Facilities for imparting training in Hindi to the non-Hindi knowing officers have also been arranged.

## USE OF HINDI LANGUAGE BY SENIOR OFFICERS

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING AND IN THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNI CATIONS (PROF. SHER SINGH): (a) At the end of 1969, thirty three senior officers were partly doing their office work in Hindi. Figures for the years 1967 and 1968 were not maintained.

(b) All officers have beer advised from time to time to use Hindi and they are afforded all facilities in this behalf by way of imparting them training and making available lists of standard Hindi phrases etc., which are in common use.
