STATEMENT

Two Centrally Sponsored Schemes, namely Centrally Sponsored Scheme for Maximised Production of Cotton and for the Development of Sea Island Cotton are being implemented for the production of Superior Medium, Long and Extra-long staple varieties of Cotton. The different components of the above two schemes during 1970-71 are given below:—

- 1. Centrally Sponsored Scheme for Maximised Production of Cotton.
 - (i) To increase the production of cotton by adoption of package of practices over an area of 4.77 lakh hectares.
 - (ii) Production of adequate quantity of Nucleus and Foundation seed over an area of 700 hectares to progressively saturate all the tracts with pure seed.
 - (iii) Laying out of Composite Demonstration plots over an area of 3980 hectares to educate the farmers in improved techniques of cotton cultivation
 - (iv) Aerial spraying of pesticides for plant protection over an area of 3.10 lakh hectares
 - (v) Organisation of Mass Plant Protection Campaigns on 0.70 lakh hectares in the rainfed tracts.
