**REACTIVATION OF INTERNATIONAL CONTROL COMMISSION IN INDO-CHINA**

\*Q9. SHRI BANKA BEHARY DAS :  
SHRI R. JAIN:

Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether following the Cambodian crisis, India has contacted Poland and Canada to reactivate the International Control Commission in Indo-China

(b) if so, the reaction of Canada and Poland in this regard; and

(c) whether both Cambodia and Laos, have requested for the reactivation of the Commission to maintain peace in that region?

THE MINISTER OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (S. IYER SWARAN SINGH): (a) and (b) The International Control Commissions in Vietnam, Laos and Cambodia are separately constituted. The International Control Commission in Cambodia was adjourned sine die with effect from 31-12-1969. Government of India are in touch with all the concerned parties about the possible reconvening of this Commission. So far there has been no agreement. The overall position remains as explained to this House on May 1970.

(c) The position about Cambodia has been stated above. The Commission in Laos continues to function to the best of its capacity in the circumstances prevailing in that country.

(a) whether it is a fact that the Scientific and Technical Advisory Committee of the Cabinet has recently submitted a report to the effect that work in the sphere of science and technology is going on in an unbalanced manner in the absence of a Central organisation and the amount of rupees one hundred and thirty six crores spent on research work during the year 1969-70 included only 6 per cent share from the private sector; and

(b) if so, what is the reaction of Government and the action taken in this regard?

†[THE PRIME MINISTER (SHRIMATI INDIRA GANDHI): (a) and (b) Yes, Sir. The Parliamentary Report on Implementation of Scientific Policy prepared by the Committee on Science and Technology points out, among other matters, certain imbalances in allocations for research and development work in certain sectors such as natural resources, training of scientific and technical manpower of high quality, support for research in universities, and research and development in private sector. The Report is to be discussed at the Conference of Scientists in November, 1970. The Government will carefully weigh the results of the Conference in considering various measures to reduce the imbalances such as allocation of more funds for research in Universities, involvement of private sector in research and development activities through the establishment of cooperative research associations, etc.]

#### P. L. 480 AGREEMENT

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF FOREIGN TRADE (CHOWDHARY RAM SEWAK): (a) and (b) Arrangements for P.L. 480 cotton by diversion of a part of the

funds provided for wheat and wheat flour were made partly in March 1970 and partly in June, 1970, because availability of cotton was short of the requirements of the textile industry and there was a pressing need for arranging additional supplies of cotton. The imported cotton was to be utilised by the mills in the normal manner according to their requirements.
