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in its eating. Tieir standard can be seen from the attaint] ients of the people who are turned out fron these colleges and universities. Ol" cour e, there are a number of colleges and universities with ioo and 200 people ard be >\v one thousand people. Why should yor have one university with 1,75,000 pupil¹ and another university with 111 pupil? It is ridiculous. So, I would request tile hon. Minister not to give any recognition to any univ rrsity unless it has sufficient standards.

Sir, enrolment, figures are given up to 1967-68 but the performance figures have not been given even for 1966-67 and for 1965-66 in this Report. Unless you show that your enrolment pattern has succeeded in the r. spective stages there is no use. It is reall f a pity that it has escaped the attention o ' the hon. Minister. Some people have filled miserably to furnish this vital infom ation of statistics. Why not We are now a November. We are discussing the Re tort for 1967-68. At least by March or A] ril or May, the pass figures in Master's cleg ee, in ordinary degree and in post-gradu->it degree standards would have come hf re. Why not they include this informatio 1 at least for 1965-66 or 1966-67 or ic 67-68. I think the hon. Minister will p ease make it a point to see that every infor nation is given not only at the university level but even at-the college level and at t ie faculty level.

Regarding student unrest, student indiscipline, student frustration and all these things, u Jess the students are able to get jobs, the) will not be able to pay full and due attent: on to their studies. In every unive-sity the tudents are given so much of tight work t iat they do not have time even to sleep jr to go to the colleges.

I have read in the autobiography of Dr. AmbedKar that he used to go to the library at 7 o dock and remained there till 11 or 12. How many people in India in the present . :ay do this? We want our teachers and pr jfessors to inculcate a spirit of hard work Si th? t their time is profitably utilised.

f Then, un :ss the teachers and demonstrators aid lecturers are attractive tiiey will not b able to guide the students properly. Then fore, only competent people should come f e/ward. Let not politician use these poor college students for their own ends. Sir, I remember having attended one lecture by spending Rs 15 because the teacher w as so attractive. In other places I never attended I seldom go and attend if the te icher is not attractive This should be the ty >e of teachers and professors and not anyboi y.

THE VICE-CHAIRMAN (SHRI AKBAR ALI KHAN): That will do. I hank you.

SHRT G. A. APPAN: Mr. Vice-Chairman, one more word about Vice-Chancellors. When there are so many able people available why should you have third cass M.A.'s and B.A's, ordinary type of persons, as Vice-Chance^ors? Can you not find Vice-Chance^ors with docctorates and persons who are eminent edu ationists? Why go by commununalism, pohticahsm or casteism? Why appoint third c.ass people as Vice-Chancellors? I would request the Minister to see that if there is anybody who is without a doctorate he should be dismissed forthwith or allowed to vacate the office in no time Unless you have cever people how c'ari you expect third class men to guide postgraduates and research people?

THE VICE-CHAIRMAN (SHRI AKBAR ALI KHAN) : Thank you.

SHRI G A. APPAN: I $_{wam\ a}$ speedie reply from the ho_n -ble Minister I want him to see that anybody who wants to appear for the various degrees or professional courses should be allowed to appear provately as piivate candidate fromi $_{97}o$ itself. I want a specific assurance.
