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It is reported hat 8 civilians including four women rec lived simple injuries and were given necc ssary treatment in -hospital.

The matter is being further investigated by the local police and the Central Reserve Police authorities Further action in this case will be tak ni on completion of investigation.

RECOMMEN IATIONS OF U.G.C

1324. DR. Dt 31 PRASAD CHATTO-PADHYAYA : Will the Minister of EDUCATION AND YOUTH SERVICES be pleased ti state:

(a) whether Gi vernment are aware of the fact thai man; of the recommendations of the University Grants Commission (1964-66) have not yet been implemented and

(b) whether Government have felt the necessity of set Ii ig up an appropriate body or requesting the University Grants Commission itsel to study the follow-up actions and devi: e ways and means for early implementation of the recommendations of the Comm ssion ?

THE MINISTER OE EDUCATION AND YOUTH SERVICES (PROF. V. K. R. V. RAO): (a) and (b) It is presumed that the member is referring to the Education Commission of 1964-66 and not the U. G. C. a; stated in the question.

The Governmen t of India have, after examination of t ie Education Commis sion's recommend itio incorporated those of national ignificance and urgency in a Governmen Resolution on the National Policy on Education in July, 1968. This Policy Statement is now the basis for the formulation and implementation of educational deve lopment plans at the Centre as well as il ihe States.

It is true that s< ireral important recommendations of the (lommission which have been accepted by Government in principle have not been implemented fully as yet Among other things, the paucity of resources is a major difficulty that impedes progress.

The follow-up of the recommendation is being done by tl .e Ministry of Education and Youth S< rvices through the plan discussions, the Ce; .tral Advisory Board of Education, the U. G. C. the N. C. E. R.T. and the periodical inferences of the State Education Ministers, Vice-Chancellors Education Secretaries and Directors of Education. For some programmes like Adult Education or School Text-books, special national Boards have also been set up. In view oC this position, it is not considered necessary to set up any other b> dy al present to follow-up the recommendations of the Education Commission.

PAY OF COLLEGE TEACHERS IN WEST BENGAL

1325. DR. DEBI PRASAD CHATTO-PADHYAYA : Will the Minister of EDUCATION AND YOUTH SERVICES be pleased to state :

(a) whether he is aware that the college teachers in West Bengal are not getting regularly their increased salary due to inordinate delay in releasing the Central grant every year;

(b) whelher the increase in pay due to scale-revision has not yet been merged with their regular pay;

(c) whether in many cases arrear pay (since April, 1966) due to scale-revision has not yet been paid; and

(d) what measures Governmen¹ propose to take in regard to parts (a)> (b) and (e) above ?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION AND YOUTH SERVICES (PROF. V. K. R. V. RAO): (a) There has been no delay on the part of the Central Government in releasing grant to the Government of West Bengal under the scheme of Revised Salary Scales of University and college teachers. So far, the following grants have been released to the State Government for implementation of the scheme, as and when required by them :
