

DECLARATION OF ASSETS BY M. P.

1329. DR. DEBIPRASAD CHATTOPADHYAYA: Will the Minister of Home Affairs be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Government of India propose to enact a law requiring Members of Parliament to declare annually their assets, liabilities and sources of income; and

(b) whether the Government of India are aware of the fact that some State Governments have already made legislation in this respect?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI VIDYA CHARAN SHUKLA):

(a) No such proposal is under consideration at present.

(b) In so far as Members of Parliament are concerned, Government of India are not aware of any such State legislation. Whether such legislation has been enacted regarding legislators in any State, is also not known.

WAITING LISTS OF PASSENGERS ON I. A. T TRUNK ROUTES

1330. SRI A. K. MOHTA: Will the Minister of TOURISM AND CIVIL AVIATION be pleased to state:

(a) the daily average number of passengers in the waiting list on the trunk routes of Indian Airlines; and

(b) the steps that are being taken to cope with the situation?

THE MINISTER OF TOURISM AND CIVIL AVIATION (DR. KARAN SINGH): (a) and (b) The information is given below—

Route	Average number of passengers in the waiting list and the steps taken to cope with the situation.
Delhi-Bombay	Nil.
Bombay-Delhi	There is a waiting-list on two services <i>i.e.</i> 404 and 406 but waitlisted passengers are cleared on service No. IC-187 (Bombay-Delhi) which is the last flight, operating

ex-Bombay at 20.00 hrs. Waitlist, it any on 181/183 service (Bombay—Deihi) is cleared on Air-India flights.

Delhi-Madras	Nil.
Madras-Delhi	Four.
Delhi-Calcutta	Thirtyfive to forty. As far as possible the passengers are cleared through the stopping service between Delhi and Calcutta and through the NAMS (Night Air Mail Service).
Calcutta-Delhi	The average number of passengers on the waiting list on Service No. IC-263 is 6 and on 402, ten. Passengers have the option to travel by NAMS operated by Indian Airlines.
Bombay-Calcutta	Fifteen. Passengers, are, however, cleared on Air-India service, whenever available and on night Air Mail Services of Indian Airlines.
Calcutta-Bombay	Six. In Flight No. IC-130 and 7 on IC-176. Passengers are cleared on Air-India services whenever available and NAMS operated by Indian Airlines.
Bombay-Madras	5. On 3 days a week the waitlisted passengers are cleared on Air-India services.
Madras-Bombay	5. Passengers are cleared on Air-India service on 3 days a week, whenever possible. Waitlisted passengers are also cleared <i>via</i> Hyderabad and Bangalore.
Madras-Calcutta	Four.
Calcutta-Madras	5. Passengers have the option to travel by NAMS operated by Indian Airlines.
