Shortage of NPK Fertilizers in West Bengal

1618. SHRI CHITTABRATA MAJUMDAR:
SHRI DIPANKAR MUKHERJEE:

Will the Minister of CHEMICALS AND FERTILIZERS be pleased to state:

(a) whether all potato growing districts in West Bengal are facing acute shortage of NPK fertilizers; and

(b) if so, the details of the shortage faced and time bound action plan to rush NPK fertilizers to the above districts, district-wise?

THE MINISTER OF CHEMICALS AND FERTILIZERS (SHRI RAM VILAS PASWAN): (a) and (b) DAP and complex fertilizers are decontrolled and their availability depends on market forces of demand and supply. About 65,000 MP DAP was made available to West Bengal from 1st October to 30th November, 2004 which was sufficient to support the sales of 59,000 MT during the period. The State Government has not reported any serious shortage of complex fertilizers.
