THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF FOREIGN TRADE 'CHOWDHARY RAM SEWAK) : (a) and (b) During the 1st five months of 1969-70 the rate of growth of export was 3.6% as compaied to 13.6% achieved in '963-C9. It is yet too early to forecast the extent of fall at the end of the year. Every effort is, how being made to reach the targetted growth of 7%.

(c) The main reasons for the rieclarduring the current year are less buoyant world trading conditions than in 1968, increase in internal demand, rise in the domestic price level, losses in production and export on account of industrial unrest, and the shortage in supply of essential raw materials.

(*d*) Our export performance is conunder review and necessary measures to boost exports are being taken from time to time in the light of experience gained.
