- (b) The House has been kept informed, from time to time, of the Pakistani mili tary build-up and the acquisition of military equipment from various sources. The Ilyshin-28 bomber squadron and the Mig-19 sqadrons were supplied to Pakistan by China and not the USSR.
- (c) Pakistan has acquired military equipment from various countries, including China, USSR and France. As stated in the House, in reply to Unstarred Question No. 314 on 24th July 1969, Governments' views regarding arms supplies to Pakistan have been brought to the notice of all friendly governments through diplomatic channels.
- (d) and (e) As indicated in the Annual Reports of the Ministry, several measures have been taken to reorganise our armed forces by reducing the administrative tail and improving its lire-power and mobility. This increase in the teeth to tail ratio has been achieved without exceeding the authorised manpower ceiling and cannot be construed as a reduction in our military strength.
