THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PETROLEUM AND CHEMICALS AND MINES AND METALS (SHRI D. R. CHAVAN): (a) No, Sir.

(b) The possibilities of collaboration in oil exploration between the two countries have been discussed in a very general way. This matter may be pursued at a later date.

DEATHS DUE TO HEART ATTACKS

- 467. SHRI THILLAI VILLALAN: Will the Minis er of HEALTH AND FAMILY PLANNING AND WORKS, HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT be plessed to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that during recent time there has been an increase in the rate of deaths due to heart attacks in the country and
- (b) if so, what are the preventive measures taken by Government in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTEY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY PLANNING AND WORKS, HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT (SHRI B. S. MURTHY): (a) It is the general impression of the heart specialists and physicians in the country that there is an increase in the rate of deaths due to heart attacks though there has been no definite controlled study to this effect.

(b) There is no single etilogical factor which can be preventive. What is needed is a proper appreciation among the people affected of the known causative factors such as high blood pressure, increased blood cholestrol, diabetes, smoking, obesity and decreased physical activity.

UNUTILISED CAPACITY IN PUBLIC UNDERTAKINGS

- (b) The measures taken to improve capacity utilisation come broadly in the following categories:
 - (1) Diversification of production.
 - (2) Promotion of Exports.
 - (3) Coordination with requirements of other public undertakings.
 - (4) Introduction of modern management techniques.

In regard to diversification, Hindustan Machine Tools has already commenced production of horizontal boring single-spindle automatics, multiple-spindle automatics, etc., and they have proposals to take up the manufacture of a few more items. Similarly Foundry Forge Plant of the Heavy Engineering Corporation has undertaken manufacture of gun barrels, pipe moulds, components for marine diesel engines. Proposals for diversification are under consideration by National Instruments Ltd., Mining & Allied Machinery Corporation. Heavy Machine Tool Plant of Heavy Engineering Corporation.
