1789. SHRI ABDUL WAHAB PEEVEE: Will the Minister of CULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) whether ASI (Archaeological Survey of India) has recommended any place in Kerala to be declared as World Heritage Centre; and

(b) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING AND MINISTER OF CULTURE (SHRI S. JAIPAL REDDY): (a) and (b) As per provisions of the operational Guidelines for the Implementation of the World Heritage Convention, each State Party has to submit to the World Heritage Committee a tentative list of properties which it intends to nominate for inscription on the World Heritage List. The Mattanchery Palace, Ernakulam, Kerala has already been included in the tentative list of UNESCO from India.

THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING AND MINISTER OF CULTURE (SHRI S. JAIPAL REDDY): (a) and (b) The Chhatia Math in Orissa is not a protected monument of State Archaeology Department or Archaeological Survey of India. The Math is under private management which is responsible for its maintenance.
