INCREASE OF SHIPPING FREIGHT RATES

•379. SHRI YELLA REDDY : SHRI M. V. BHADRAM :

Will the Minister of PARLIAMENT-ARY AFFAIRS AND SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT be pleased to state :

(a) whether the U. S. Atlantic-India Conference Lines has unilaterally decided to raise the shipping freight rates on all cargoes by 12 per cent with effect from August next;

(b) whether the same Conference Lines had raised the freight rates by 7 per cent last year ;

(c) whether such frequent rise in freight rates will adversely affect India's foreign trade ; and

(d) if so, what steps have been taken by Government against such arbitrary increase in freight rates ?

THE MINISTER OF PARLIA-MENTARY AFFAIRS AND SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT (SHRI K. RAGHURAMAIAH) : (a) The India-Pakhtan -Ceylon and Burma/U.S.A. Outward Freight Conference which handles India's imports from the Atlantic coast of U.S.A. had notified ageneral increase of 12% in freight rates to be effective from 1-8-1969.

(b) Thi3 Conference has effected an increase of J^{\$%} from January 1969.

(c) Shipping freight rate is only one of several factors which influence the foreign trade of the country. It is, therefore, difficult to isolate the effect of a single factor on the rise or fall in the trade.

(d) Government is pressing all the Conferences operating in India's foreign trade to agree to prior consultation with shippers before imposing any general freight increases. In the present case, the Conference has, as a result of discussions with the representatives of the Government of India and the All India Shippers' Council, reduced the quantum of increase from 12% to 5% and has als» put off the effective date from 1-8-1969 to 1-10-1969.

◆380. SHRI M. V. BHADRAM : Will the Minister of PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS AND SHIPPING AND TRA-NSPORT be pleased to state :

(c) whether there is a proposal to instruct the said officers to disassociate themselves from the said company ?

THE MINISTER OF PARLIAMEN-TARY AFFAIRS AND SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT (SHRI K. RAGHU-RAMAIAH; : (a) Four.

(b) No, Madam. Port launches, boats and other equipment are not exclusively used for survey work- Orders have also been issued by the Port Trust that port launches and other survey materials should not be used for conducting surveys without recovery of hire charges.

(c) No, Madam. The work does not interfere with their normal duties and is undertaken during their spare time.

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state :

(*a*) whether the attention of Government has been drawn to a report published in the *Times of India' dated June 9, 1969 (Delhi Edition) to the effect that Shri Jaya Prakash Narayan in his inaugural address to the National Conference of Voluntary Agencies at the Gandhi Peace Foundation in New Delhi on June 8, 1969 said that he sympathised with Naxalites because "they are doing something for the people" and also that "if I am convinced that there is no deliverance of the people except through violence, I will take to violence" ; and

(b) if so, what do government propose to do to stop such open support to Naxa-lites and violence by persons like Shri Jaya Prakash Narayan ?

THE MrNrSTER OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI Y. B. CHAVAN) : (a) Yes, Madam.

(b) The major theme of the speech of Shri Jaya Prakash Narayan was a powerful plea for non-violent social revolution. He argued that basically violence does not change society in a fundamental way.

Scientist, have since been examined to assess its merits for practical exploitation;

(c) if not, the reasons for the delay in examining the *new* process indigenously developed which, it is reported, has already own international acclaim but has not even yet been considered by Council of Scientific and Industrial Research ?

The National Metallurgical Laboratory of the C.S.I.R. would be happy to assist in assessing the merits of the invention if the material and related data are supplied to the Laboratory.

FOOD SERVED IN I. A. C. PLANES
