PRODUCTION OF STAINLESS STEEL BY NEW **PROCESS**

1076. SHRI B. C. PATTANAYAK: Will the Minister of STEEL AND HEAVY ENGINEERING be pleased to state whether in view of the growing shortage of stainless steel what steps do Government propose to take to commercially exploit a new process developed by an Indian Metallurgist of indigenously manufacturing Stainless Steel, which has been patented as Indian Patent Specification No. 91020, and which has already generated wide interest abroad?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF STEEL AND HEAVY ENGINEERING (SHRI K. C. PANT): The question presumably refers to patent taken by one Dr. D. R. Malhotra, Retired Metallurgist, for a process for the production of aluminium manganese alloy steel, claimed to possess corrosion resistance properties comparable to stainless steel. Import of low carbon ferromanganese and low carbon ferro-aluminium were desired by Dr. D. R. Malhotra for carrying out trial production. This request was duly recommended. The National Metallurgical Laboratory of CS1R would be happy to assist in assessing the merits of the invention if the material and related data are supplied to the Laboratory.
