THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE (SHRI P C. SETHI). (a) and (b) Yes, Madam The U K Government has pledged an amount of £38 million (Rs. 68.4 crores) as aid to India for 1969-70 to cover debt relief, imports of a wide variety of maintenance goods and capital goods and for financing The aid indicated will be in the form of interest-free loans repayable over a period of 25 years inclusive of a grace period of 7 years Detailed arrangements are under discussion with the U K. Government, except in respect of £7 5 million (Rs 13 5 crores) as debt relief for which an agreement has already been signed.

SHORTAGE OF DOCTORS IN RURAL AREAS

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FA-MILY PLANNING AND WORKS. HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOP-MENT (DR. S CHANDRASEKHAR): (a) Yes, doctors are generally reluctant for posting in rural areas. However, out Health Centres funcof 4,919 Primar tioning there were only 352 such centres without doctors in the 31-3-1969.

(b) and (c) While there is no proposal to introduce a c mpulsory service for the doctors in rural areas, the Third Conference of Deans and Principals of Medical Colleges rece nmended that in the internship programme, one year's work for Maternity and (hild Health and Family Planning in a rulal centre should be compulsory, and if recessary, the total period of internship could be increased by six months or a year.

This recommendation is under consideration in consultation with the Medical Council of India and the State Governments.
