(b) We have opened two new Commerical Missions in L itin America at Caracas (Venezuela) ard Lima (Peru). India proposes also t) participate in the International Trade Fair in Lima in 1970. Consideration i. being given to negotiating bilateral tr ide arrangements between India and some Latin American countries.

Besides, the Indian Economic and Trade Delegation sponsored by FICCI has visited this region in April-May, 1969. Its report is expected to be submitted very soon.

No provision has so far been included in the Draft Fourth Plan for the establishment of any new atomic power stations other than those on which work has already commenced.
