- (c) whether the Government of Punjab have again requested the Government of India to establish an atomic power plant in Punjab on priority basis; and
- (d) if so, what is the reaction of the Government of India thereto?

(b) Does not arise.

(c) and (d) Yes, Madam, The Chief Minister of Punjab requested Prime Minister in February 1969 that provision should be made in the Fourth Plan for the establishment of a 600 MWe nuclear power station in that State. No provision has so far been included in the Draft Fourth Plan for the establishment of any new atomic power stations other than those on which work has already commenced.
