(c) the status of implementation of projects with likely date of completion?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF NON-CONVENTIONAL ENERGY SOURCES (SHRI VILAS MUTTEMWAR): (a) Central financial assistance of Rs. 69-16 crore has been released to West Bengal under various non-conventional energy programmes for the development of non-conventional energy during the last three years, *i.e.* 2001-02 to 2003-04.

(b) and (c) State-wise funds are not allocated under various non-conventional energy programmes. However, central financial assistance of Rs. 1.36 crore has already been released to West Bengal under various non-conventional energy programmes, as on 31-10-2004. The non-conventional energy programmes are implemented by the State Government through its agencies and are expected to be completed as per schedule.

#### **Development of wind energy**

2142. SHRI V. HANUMANTHA RAO: Will the Minister of NON-CONVENTIONAL ENERGY SOURCES be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have launched any pilot schemes to develop wind energy along the Eastern Coast of India;

(b) if so, what are the details of such pilot projects launched by Government;

(c) what assistance was given by Government;

(d) whether there is any programme to expand the generation of wind energy in the country; and

(e) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF NON-CONVENTIONAL ENERGY SOURCES (SHRI VILAS MUTTEMWAR): (a) Wind Power Programme being implemented by the Ministry *inter alia* supports setting up of demonstration wind power projects in potential areas including in Eastern Coast of India.

(b) and (c) A demonstration wind power project of 2 MW capacity has been commissioned in Frazerganj in Sundarbans area of West Bengal. Besides, wind diesel project of 500 KW capacity has also been sanctioned at Sagar Islands in West Bengal. The first phase of this project of 100 KW has already been commissioned. Amount of Rs. 4.7 crore has been released by the Government to the State Nodal Agency in West Bengal for the above projects.
