1648. SHRI CHITTA BASU: Will the Minister of FOOD AND AGRI-CULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have estimated the deficit in the quantity of fertilizer required for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71; and

(b) if so, te steps Government propose to take to meet the deficit?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FOOD, AGRICUL-TURE, COMMUNITY DEVELOP-MENT AND COOPERATION (SHRI ANNASAHEB SHINDE): (a) and (b) Government have estimated the deficit by which the domestic production of fertilisers falls short of the requirements for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71. Imports of fertilisers from abroad are being arranged to meet the deficit. For the current year, availability of fertilisers in the country through domestic production and imports is adequate to meet the requirements of farmers.

The estimated requirements of fertilivers, the estimated domestic production, the gap between the two and the imports planned for the current year (1969-70) are as follows:—
