As regards B. A. (Pass), B. A. (Hons.) and B. Com. Courses, students have been admitted directly by the Colleges. Further, students apply to more than one College simultaneously. It is, therefore, not possible to indicate the number of students who applied for admission to these Courses. It has, however, been found by the University, through a special registration,

that 1,285 students with 40% and above marks in the Higher Secondary Examination have been left out. The University is now making efforts with the help of the University Grants Commission and the Delhi Administration to provide admission to these students too.
