

(iv) A Desert Development Board has been set up to keep under review the preparation and execution of schemes for development of desert areas and removal of administrative bottlenecks etc. This Board has recommended priority for schemes relating to pasture development, soil conservation, afforestation, agricultural development, etc., in the desert areas of Rajasthan, Gujarat and Haryana.

(v) Suitable programmes of lasting benefit in scarcity frequented areas with a view to preventing drought and minimising its ill-effects are under consideration. Two schemes of minor irrigation and soil conservation costing Rs. 30 lakhs have been taken up in 11 talukas of hard (ore) areas in Ananipur district in Andhra Pradesh during the year 1968-69.

(vi) Other development programmes such as extension of irrigation to new areas and dry farming would also help to reduce the imbalances.

**DIRECT TELEPHONE DIALLING SYSTEM
BETWEEN DELHI AND GWALIOR**

589. SARDAR D. K. JADHAV: Will the Minister of INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING AND COMMUNICATIONS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that Government are considering to start direct telephone dialling system between Delhi and Gwalior keeping in view the historic and other importance of Gwalior; and

(b) if not, the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING AND IN THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNICATIONS (PROF. SHER SINGH): (a) and (b) Proposals to provide subscribers trunk dialling facility between Delhi and Gwalior are dependent on the installation of a Trunk Automatic Exchange at Agra and microwave circuits between Agra and Gwalior. These works are likely to be completed by the end of the Fourth Five Year Plan. Thus, the subscriber trunk dialling facility is likely to be available only after Fourth Five Year Plan period.
