MI SLIM SENA IN DELHI

(b) if so, the reaction of Government thereto?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI VIDYA CHARAN SHUKLA): (a) According to information furnished by the Delhi Administration Dr. Z. Abbas Malik, Municipal Councillor, Delhi announced at a public meeting on February 25, 1969 that he proposed to set up a volunteer corps to provide protection to the religious places of Muslims and to safeguard generally the community's interests in Delhi. On 19th April, 1969, Dr. Malik said that the organisation would be known as 'Muslim Sena'. About 20/22 volunteers are reported to have appeared in public for the first time on the evening of April 24, 1969. When a public meeting was held in Urdu Bazar.

(b) Action under the law will be taken in case any unlawful activities come to notice.
