THE MINISTER OF HOME All'AIRS (SHRI Y. B. CHAVAN): (a) Guidelines tentatively approved by ihc Press Council of India as to what would constitute a breach of journalistic ethics or proprieties in the matter of communal writings were received from the Chairman on Gih December, 1968.

(b) A copy of trie guidelines is laid on ihe table of the House. [See Appendix LXVIII, Annexure No. 55] As requested by the Chairman of the Press Council, the guidelines have been placed before the Sub-Committee of the National Integration Council on Communalism.
