THE MINISTER OF RAILWAYS (DR. RAM SUBHAG SINGH): (a) and (b) In connection with the simplification of accounting procedure on Railways as recommended by a Director on Special Duty, who was specially appointed for this purpose, a good deal of preparatory work had to be done before new accounting machines arrived from 1963-64. To accomplish this preparatory work competently and quickly a selected Assistant Accounts Officer was placed on special duty on each of the Zonal Railway. These Officers have completed their preparatory work and the simplification of the accounts procedure has been progressed in well defined stages. The Accounts Officers on Special Duty were not required to submit any formal reports—their principal assignment being preparation of the ground for introduction of the simplified accounting procedures as smoothly as possible on each of the Zonal Railways.

(c) The total expenditure incurred upto March, 1968 is Rs. 4.38 crores and an expenditure of Rs. 1.85 crores is further expected to be incurred till its completion in all respects, including payment of land debits.

THE MINISTER OF RAILWAYS (DR. RAM SUBHAG SINGH): (a) and (b) Yes. In this accident one person was killed and another 18 were injured of whom 3 sustained grievous injuries. The cost of damage to railway property has been estimated at approximately Rs. 14,86,000

- (c) and (d) The Additional Commissioner of Railway Safety has held his statu-tory inquiry into this accident. According to his provisional finding, the accident was due to the failure of railway staff.
- (e) Applications for compensation when received will be decided by the ex officio Claims Commissioner. No application for compensation has been received so far.
