CONSTRUCTION OF BORDER ROADS

870. SHRI B. C. PATTANAYAK: Will the Minister of DEFENCE be pleased to state:

- (a) the total amount spent so far on the construction of border roads; and
- (b) how many more new roads are proposed to be constructed keeping in view the defence of India.

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SARDAR SWARAN SINGH): (a) The total amount spent in cash upto the end of November 1968 on Capital works included in the immediate programme of the Border Roads Development Board is Rs. 275.80 crores.

(b) The immediate programme of the Border Roads Development Board, which takes into account the requirement of the General Staff, includes the construction of 6,947 Kms of new roads and improvement of 4,707 Kms of the existing roads. After due consideration of priorities, additional roads will be included in the immediate programme as required. It is not feasible to forecast these requirements in advance.

ATOMIC POWER STATION AT TARAPUR AND OTHER ATOMIC POWER PLANTS

871. SHRI ARJUN ARORA: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

- (a) when the Atomic power station at Trapore is expected to supply electric energy; and
- (b) the progress made in the construction of other atomic power plants in the country?

THE PRIME MINISTER (SHRI-MATI INDIRA GANDHI): (a) Tarapur Atomic Power Station consists of two units with a capacity of 190 MW each. It is expected that full commercial operation will be achieved by July this year.

(b) In addition to the Power Station at Tarapur, the following atomic power stations are at present under construction, the dates by which they are expected to be commissioned being as follows:—

THE PRIME MINISTER (SHRIMATI INDIRA GANDHI): (a) Yes, Sir. The Chief Minister of Kerala has submitted a paper entitled "An Outline of Alternate Policies for the Fourth Plan" embodying the conclusions of the Seminar on "Alternate Fourth Plan Policies" held under the auspicies of the Kerala State Planning Board at Trivandrum during October 9-12, 1968.

(b) The basic policy implications relating to the Fourth Plan set down in the document on "Approach to the Fourth Plan" were discussed in the National Development Council held in September, 1968 where the Chief Minister was present and expressed his views.

MISHRA): (a) The Section consists of one Staff Assistant, one Senior Technical Assistant, two Junior Technical Assistants, one Upper Division Clerk, one Lower Division Clerk and one Peon. Their work is supervised by a staff Officer (who deals with other subjects also), functioning under the guidance and control of Assistant Director General, Ordnance (Administration) and Deputy **Factories** General, Ordnance Factories Director (Administration).

(b) The nature of work handled in the Section relates to organisation, development, inspection of accounts and securing of necessary Government financial assistance in respect of various types of Co-operative Societies in the Ordnance and Clothing Factories and training of factory employees in co-operatives. The qualifications prescribed for the various posts are given in the statement attached.
