DIESEL POWER NUCLEAR SUBMARINES WITH CHINA

607 PROF. SHANTILAL KOTHA-RI: Will the Minister of DEFENCE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that China is proposing to have 12-15 diesel power

nuclear submarines; if so, the details thereof; and

(b) what is the reaction of the Government of India thereto?

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SARDAR SWARAN SINGH): (a) Government are aware that China is planning to develop submarines which can fire long range missiles from a submerged position.

(b) Government's policy in regard to nuclear threat from China has already been stated in the House.

PAK'S USE OF AID ARMS AGAINST INDIA

(b) and (c) The Government of India are aware of Pakistan's efforts to acquire arms and equipment from all sources. The Government are alive to the possibility of these arms being used against India and are taking all necessary steps to meet the threat posed by Pakistan's arms build-up.
