## LATE RUNNING OF FRONTIER MAIL

677. SHJil G. R. PATIL: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to :state:

- (a) the number of times the Frontier Mail was running late during the last six months!:
  - (b) the reasons for its late running; and
- (c) the action taken by Government to improve the situation?

THE MINISTER OF RAILWAYS (SHRI C M. POONACHA): (a) Nos. 3Dn/4Up Frontier Mails arrived late at Delhi Junction and Bombay Central or. 84 and 34 occasions respectively during the six months January 10 June 1968.

- (b) Late running of this train was -caused chiefly by Control and Signal faLures resulting from thefts of telecommunication and other essential equipment, alarm chain pulling on other trains resulting in dislocation of running schedules on the saturated single line sections en-route between Bombay Central and New Delhi, etc.
- (c) A close watch is kept on the punctual running of this and other trains at all levels from ine Divisions to the Railway Board. All cases of avoidable detentions are taken up for corrective and punitive action. Every effort feasible is being made to ensure ihe punctual running of the Frontier Mails.

## CONVERSION OF MIRAJ-KOLHAPUR METER GAUGE INTO BROAD GAUGE LINE

678. SHRI G. R. PATIL: Will the Minister cf RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government have taken any decision regarding the conversion of Miraj-Kolhapur Meter Gauge line into Broad Gauge line;
- (b) if so, the details regarding the alignment, total estimate e!c. of the proposed Broad Gauge line; and
- (.<:) by what time the work will commence and be completed?

'IHE MINISTER OF RAILWAYS (SHRI C. M. POONACHA): (a) The question of taking up this work immediately is under consideration.

- (b) The conversion which is estimated to cost about Rs. 2.5 crores will be along the existing alignment, Miraj remaining as the take-off point.
- (c) The work is likely to be taken up during the current working season and is likely to be completed by the end of 1969.
