RECRUITMENT IN DELHI POLICE

*485. SHRI M. ASAD MADANI: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether recruitment was made for the Delhi Police in the last week of May, 1968;
- (b) if so, what was the total number of persons recruited;
- (c) whether it is a fact that two candidates belonging to the minority community who were declared successful in all the tests were not recruited; and
- (d) if so, what were the grounds on which they were not recruited?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI VIDYA CHARAN SHUKLA): (a) to (d) In the last week of May, 1968, 43 Constables were enlisted in the Delhi Police based on the recruitment tests held earlier. Six of them belong to the minority communities. There was no instance of not recruiting any candidate belonging to any minority community who was declared successful and found fit.

PRODUCTION OF PROTEIN FROM PETROLEUM

- (a) whether it is a fact that protein is now being produced from petroleum in substantial quantity in the country;

of proteins from petroleum, if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION (DR. TRIGUNA SEN): (a) and (b) One hundred kilograms of protein concentrates from gas oil fractions have been produced for acceptability trials at the pilot plant set up by the Indian Institute of Petroleum at Dehra Dun.

The Regional Research Laboratory, Jorhat is also producing protein from petroleum hydrocarbons in a semipilot plant scale for nutritional trials.

- (c) No, Sir.
- (d) Not yet, Sir. as the acceptability trials are still underway.
