CENTRAL GRANT FOR THE SURVEY OF TRIBAL AREAS IN ANDHRA PRADESH

1100. SHRI SANDA NARAYA-NAPPA: Will the Minister of SOCIAL WELFARE be pleased to state:

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF IRRIGATION AND POWER (PROF. SIDDHESHWAR PRASAD): (a) to (d) A project report of the Somasila Project was received in the Central Water and Power Commission in 1965. The estimated cost of the project was given as Rs. 17 crores.

The project was examined by the Central Water and Power Commission and their comments on the hydrological aspects were sent to the State Government. The State Government informed the Commission that the project was being revised. The revised project report is awaited.
