SUPREME COURT JUDGMENT ON SENIORITY OF IPS OFFICERS

1124 PROF. SAIYID NURUL HASAN: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government's attention was drawn to the judgment given by the Supreme Court in an appeal filed by an IPS officer of Uttar Pradesh that the Government of India were not justified in not taking into account the period during which an officer had officiated continuously in the 'senior scale prior to May, 1951, in determining the year of allotment, and directed that seniority may be fixed in accordance with the approved seniority rules;
- (b) whether the said decision of the Supreme Court is being followed in determining the seniority of IPS/IAS officers whose cases attract the principles laid down by the decision; and
 - (c) if not, the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI VIDYA CHARAN SHUKLA): (a) Yes. Sir.

(b) and (c). The year of allotment of the IPS officer, who filed the appeal In the Supreme Court, has since been revised in accordance with the judgement of the Court. Suitable necessary action is being taken in respect of other officers also after consulting the State Governments concerned.

FOREIGN SCHOLARSHIPS FOR INDIAN STUDENTS

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (PROF. SHER SINGH): (a) and (b) The requisite information is contained in the statement laid on the table of the House. [See Appendix LXV, Annexure No. 100.]

(c) All the scholarships mentioned in Annexure A of the statement are awarded through the Ministry of Education, while those in Annexure B are awarded direct.

The decisions taken on the Committee's recommendations and the phased programme drawn up for their implementation are indicated in Appendix II.

A Statement showing decisions which have been wholly or partly implemented so far is enclosed as Appendix III.

The recommendations which have been accepted by Government (Appendix II) but not yet implemented are continually under review with reference to finances available, and will be implemented when finances permit.
