

THE MINISTER OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI DINESH SINGH) :  
(a) Yes, Sir.

(b) The 15 countries which voted against the General Assembly Resolution calling for the suspension of trade and economic relations with South Africa are—Australia, Belgium, Canada, France, Greece, Ireland, Japan, Luxembourg, Netherlands, New Zealand, Portugal, Spain, Turkey, U. K. and U.S.A.

(c) At the last session, the U. N. General Assembly adopted resolution No. 2396 cosponsored by India requesting the Security Council to consider urgently the question for adopting effective measures, under Chapter VII of the Charter, to ensure the full implementation of comprehensive mandatory sanctions against South Africa.

In the same resolution the General Assembly condemned the actions of all those States which are continuing to maintain commercial and other relations with South Africa in violation of its resolutions. India will continue to support efforts in the U.N. aimed at securing the termination of apartheid in South Africa.

DISRESPECT TO PRIME MINISTER AT COMMONWEALTH PRIME MINISTERS CONFERENCE

(a) to (c) Inferences drawn from the photograph are wholly unwarranted. The Prime Minister was not only shown utmost courtesy but her presence at the Commonwealth Conference was regarded as a matter of great consequence to the Commonwealth. The position in the photograph was in accordance with the order of precedence.

- (5) Shri G. C. Dutt

The Prime Minister did not visit any other country during this tour.

(b) Rs. 1,12,490 (approximately) out of which Rs. 43,130 (approximately) was spent in foreign exchange.
